Polanyi's "Curse" and Crises of the Second Great Transformation in China

7. Abstract

Inspired by Karl Polanyi, the emerging of market economy in China and other post-commun ist regimes has been described as a "Second Great Transformation" by Michael Buroway. C hina's transition to the market oriented economy so far has received remarkable growth, but potential crises accelerated as well. Whether a double social movement would finally erupt is a perennial debate among observers of China studies. This article demonstrates ongoing c hanges of state-business relationship in China since last five years and discusses their impact s for both China and the world. Polanyi's "curse" on a populist society would happen if the current reforms could not create institutionalized channels for new social forces.
